Will Chile be able to develop energy storage projects in 2023? In 2022, Chile passed an energy storage and electromobility bill, which made stand-alone storage projects profitable, but the market is still expecting new rules on capacity payment for storage projects, which are to be approved in 2023. Chile has also put in place an auction procedure to award public land for the development of BESS projects. How can Chile keep up with the changing energy demand landscape? The share of renewables in Chile's power mix has been growing at a fast pace and reached 58% in 2022.
