



Import tax on solar systems in Ghana

All solar panels imported into Ghana are exempt from VAT and industrial or energy plant, machinery or equipment are exempt from import duty. Additionally, all off-grid solar system components are VAT exempt as well. Under the ECOWAS Common External Tariffs, Ghana now operates Five-Band Tax Rates. These are: Note: The above enumerated tax rates are not in respect of Import Duty only; they are also an imposition of the following: Ghana relies on the Harmonized System (HS) code to identify and categorize goods that cross its borders. Tariffs are based on value (ad valorem) or weight or volume (specific) and are subject to change.
