As you know, customs regulations widely depend on the country. Before traveling to (or from) Italy make sure to check the allowance and limits for the next things: How does a power supply work in Italy? They run on DC which is derived from a small transformer inside the plug or adapter. Most of these transformers can convert any voltage from between 100V and 240V, so will work fine in Italy with no voltage alteration. You can tell if they're rated for higher voltages by looking at the small print on the device. What do I need to know about Italy's electricity supply? The important thing to know is that Italy doesn't just differ in shape and size of sockets, but can also differ in voltage delivery - and the latter is a safety issue. What important safety information do I need to know about Italy's electricity supply? Italy works with a domestic electricity supply of 230 volts. What voltage do I need to bring to Italy? You need to check the voltage for any electronics you're planning on bringing to Italy - the input range must include 220V or 230V.
