



Nepal exports solar energy storage

According to a report released by energy think tank EMBER in October, solar alone contributed 83 percent of the rise, while fossil fuels saw a slight decline, with generation falling in China and India. Nepal has a solar power potential of 432 gigawatts (432,000 megawatts), over ten times. At a time when Nepal should be accelerating energy development to expand electricity exports to India, the government's repeated requests to increase exports highlight a stark contradiction--Nepal is struggling to meet its own energy needs while simultaneously seeking to sell power abroad.
