Will China build a solar power plant in Nicaragua? The Chinese state-owned company China Communications Construction Company Limited (CCCC) will build a photovoltaic solar power plant with a capacity of 67.3 megawatts in Nicaragua, the government of the Central American country announced on Monday. How much energy does Nicaragua use? According to the International Energy Agency, Nicaragua supplies around 60% of its total energy from renewable sources, including wind, solar and geothermal, with biomass - an often contested renewable - accounting for the largest share, at roughly 40% of total supply. Does Nicaragua have geothermal power? The Maribios Range is part of the Pacific "Ring of Fire" and contains several active volcanoes. The government estimates Nicaragua's geothermal potential to be 2,000 megawatts. Nicaragua's National Electric Transmission Company (Enatrel) seeks to transform the country's energy mix by focusing on renewable energy with its expansion plan.
