What is the cost of electricity in Slovenia? The cost of electricity for household consumers in Slovenia in the second quarter of was 0.165 EUR per kWh. This represents a 7% increase over the first quarter. For non-household consumers, the average electricity price without value added tax was 0.089 EUR per kWh, which is a 2% increase. Where does Slovenia's electricity come from? Approximately one-third of Slovenian electricity consumption is derived from two brown-coal and lignite fired power stations. These ageing power stations account for all of the domestically mined coal. What is Slovenia's energy sector? Slovenia's energy sector is marked by a balanced mix of sources. The country's electricity generation is largely reliant on nuclear power and hydroelectricity. Nuclear energy, primarily from the Krsko Nuclear Power Plant, plays a crucial role in meeting domestic electricity needs while ensuring energy stability. What is Slovenia's energy strategy? This blend of nuclear and hydroelectric power forms the backbone of Slovenia's energy strategy, aligning with its environmental goals and energy needs. As a member of the European Union, Slovenia is an active participant in the EU electricity market. Does Slovenia have nuclear power? Nuclear energy stands as a primary source of electricity in Slovenia. The Krsko Nuclear Power Plant, jointly owned with Croatia, is a major element in Slovenia's energy infrastructure, providing a significant portion of the country's electricity. This reliance on nuclear power underscores Slovenia's commitment to a low-carbon energy future. Does Slovenia have gas storage facilities? Slovenia does not have gas storage facilities, and is dependent on infrastructure in Austria and Croatia. Slovenia has expressed interest in securing U.S. LNG sources via terminals in Krk, Croatia, or Rovigo, Italy, to diversify its supply. Beginning in , Geoplin booked additional capacity to acquire LNG from the Krk terminal.
